# ELS DAY STUDENTS

## SCHEDULE OF FEES - 2019/20

### Notes :

- There is a minimum attendance of two days in Stages 1-3 and three days in Stage 4.
- Ad hoc bookings should be booked a week in advance and incur an additional £5.00 charge per day. A minimum of 48 hours' notice must be given for any cancellation. Cancellation of ad hoc bookings will incur an administrative charge of £5.00.
- We offer special holiday session bookings for our Term Time only children. These are booked and paid for in advance and are non-refundable. Holiday sessions are charged at the standard daily rate. A limited number of flexible ad hoc bookings may be made available once the holiday booking period has closed; these are charged as per ad hoc sessions above.
- Fees are inclusive of all milk, nappies, meals and snacks as appropriate. Formula milk is provided up to the age of 12 months; from which cow's milk is provided. The ELS provides a particular brand of milk, wipes and nappies; if parents prefer a different type of each then they are welcome to provide their own.
- Specialist classes in art, music, dance, drama, sports, forest fun sessions and language teaching are also included in the daily fee during term time as appropriate.
- Children aged 3 and 4 are entitled to access 15 hours of EYFE a week. Your child is eligible for this free entitlement from the start of the term following their third birthday until the end of the term of your child's fifth birthday. Reddam House offers EYFE for up to six hours per day during Term Time only. We are delighted to be able to offer two options for extended provision (30 hours) to all eligible families - please contact the ELS Administrator for details.
- Childcare vouchers can be used for all fees for children below five years of age, and hours outside of the core day for children up to their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- On registering your child, a registration fee of £100 is requested and an additional deposit of £250 is required which will be refunded in the first month's fees. If your child does not join the ELS the registration fee and deposit are non-refundable.
- Fees are due on or before the first day of the month. Late fees of 3% pa will be applied to all overdue accounts.

### ACTIVITIES AND CLUBS

Some extra-curricular activities attract an additional charge and are either billed in advance, termly in arrears, or in some cases paid direct to the provider.

**NOTES:**

- Fees are due on or before the first day of term. Late fees of 3% pa will be applied to all overdue accounts.
- The above fees are inclusive of some stationery, lunches, snacks and Personal Accident Insurance. Where a child is in receipt of a scholarship, or financial assistance, the discount will be applied excluding the cost of lunches and Insurance. For the academic year 2019/20 this amount is £336 per term.
- For UK Nationals, on registering your child, a registration fee of £100 is requested and a deposit of £500 is required to accept the offered place.
- For EU Nationals, on registering your child, a registration fee of £100 is requested and a deposit of £1000 for day students is required to accept the offered place.
- For International students on registering your child, a registration fee of £100 is requested and a deposit of a term's fees is required to accept the offered place. Should a Tier 4 Visa be required, a payment of fees in advance will be required. Please contact the Registrar for more details.
- Parents with more than one child in the school will qualify for a sibling discount of 5% for the second child and the third and subsequent children will receive a 10% discount.
- All tuition, flexi boarding, and transport fees are payable in full, on or before the first day of term. Flexi boarding charges do not provide for laundry services.
- We offer an in-house monthly instalment scheme and a fees in advance scheme. Details of both can be obtained from the School's Finance Office.
- Extended Hours sessions and ad hoc boarding require a minimum of 48 hours' notice, and these may sometimes be billed in arrears.
- A term's notice is required for a change from regular boarding to day status, otherwise the boarding fee will be charged for the remainder of the term.
- Rechargeable extras include additional charges which will be made for some school textbooks, educational trips, instrumental lessons, learning support and some after school activities.
- Childcare vouchers can be used for all fees for children below five years of age, and hours outside of the core day for children up to their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday.

- Fees are due on or before the first day of term. Late fees of 3% pa will be applied to all overdue accounts.
- The above fees are inclusive of some stationery, lunches, snacks and Personal Accident Insurance. Where a child is in receipt of a scholarship, or financial assistance, the discount will be applied excluding the cost of lunches and Insurance. For the academic year 2019/20 this amount is £336 per term.
- For UK Nationals, on registering your child, a registration fee of £100 is requested and a deposit of £500 is required to accept the offered place. For Boarding students, an additional Boarding deposit of £500 is required.
- For EU Nationals, on registering your child, a registration fee of £100 is requested and a deposit of £1000 for day students is required to accept the offered place. For Boarding students, an additional Boarding deposit of £2000 is required.
- For International students on registering your child, a registration fee of £100 is requested and a deposit of a term's fees (boarding or day) is required to accept the offered place. Should a Tier 4 Visa be required, a payment of fees in advance will be required. Please contact the Registrar for more details.
- Parents with more than one child in the school will qualify for a sibling discount of 5% for the second child and the third and subsequent children will receive a 10% discount.
- All tuition, flexi boarding, and transport fees are payable in full, on or before the first day of term. Flexi boarding charges do not provide for laundry services.
- We offer an in-house monthly instalment scheme and a fees in advance scheme. Details of both can be obtained from the School's Finance Office.
- Extended Hours sessions and ad hoc boarding require a minimum of 48 hours' notice, and these may sometimes be billed in arrears.
- A term's notice is required for a change from regular boarding to day status, otherwise the boarding fee will be charged for the remainder of the term.
- Rechargeable extras include additional charges which will be made for some school textbooks, educational trips, DofE participation, CCF fees, instrumental lessons, learning support and some after school activities.
- The main external examinations are charged in the final term of Year 11 and Year 13. Examinations outside of this term, such as early entries or re-sits will be charged in the term in which they are due.
- Childcare vouchers can be used for all fees for hours outside of the core day for children up to their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday.

# *UK, EU OR INTERNATIONAL STUDENT DEFINITIONS*

## HOME (UK) STUDENTS

To be considered as a home (UK) student you normally need to meet all the following criteria on the first day of the first academic year of the course:

- You are settled in the UK (this means there is no immigration restriction on the length of your stay)
- You are ordinarily resident in the UK and have been for the full three years before the first day of the academic year. Ordinarily resident means that your main home is in the UK, and you are choosing to live in the UK.
- The main reason for you being in the UK was not to receive full-time education.

## HOME (EU) STUDENTS

You will be considered as a home (EU) student if, on the first day of the first academic year of your course:

- You are an EU national, or the relevant family member of a non-UK EU national, who is in the UK as a self-sufficient person or as a student, or the relevant family member of a UK national.
- You must have been ordinarily resident in the European Economic Area and/or Switzerland and/or the overseas territories for the three years before the first day of the first academic year of the course.
- For students who are non-native English speakers an additional English Language test will be required for entry and this will determine whether the Intensive English support classes are required. This is at the sole discretion of the Academic Support Department.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

If you do not fall under the home (UK) or home (EU) fee definitions, then you will be considered as an international student.

For students who are non-native English speakers an additional English Language test will be required for entry and this will determine whether the Intensive English support classes are required. This is at the sole discretion of the Academic Support Department. The length of the support will vary according to the level of English of the Student and the courses of study.
